Week 1

Gun violence is an urgent, complex, and multifaceted issue that requires evidence-based solutions. Every year, guns are used over 80 times more often to protect a life than to take one, according to Americangunfacts. While the U.S. has the highest gun ownership rate (88.8 per 100 residents), that does not seem to correlate with the intentional homicide rate. Per 100,000 residents, the countries with the highest intentional homicide rates are as follows: Honduras, El Salvador, Côte D'Ivoire, and Jamaica—the U.S. ranks number 103 on the list. Regardless of these statistics, gun violence is still a prevalent issue across the U.S., and it is important for gunowners to take steps to ensure their safety to reduce the risk of accidents and crime. The NRA put together a list of fundamental rules for safe handling for gun-owners to follow:

- 1. Always keep the gun pointed in a safe direction: common sense will dictate the safest direction, depending on the circumstance.
- 2. Keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot: until you are ready to fire, do not touch the trigger. This dramatically reduces the risk of an accident.
- Always keep the gun unloaded until ready to use: if you do not know how to open
 the action or inspect the chambers, get help from someone who does and leave the
 gun alone until that happens.

While there is no federal law in place, 27 states have individual laws requiring that guns be locked up to prevent access to children, and 11 states require some sort of locking device at the time between purchase and storage, according to Gun Safe Reviews Guy. According to USA Today, children under age 12 die from gun accidents in the U.S. about once a week on average, many of these deaths attributed to accessing an unsecured and loaded gun. A gun safe is a secure and protective storage container for firearms, typically requiring a lock combination or code to open. When considering the types of people who may be in your home at times unsupervised (children, guests, babysitters, friends, family members), it emphasizes the importance of purchasing a gun safe to keep these individuals out of harm's way and prevent an accident from happening.
